
INVOCATION

Job 38:1-11 Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind, and said: ² "Who *is* this who darkens counsel By words without knowledge? ³ Now prepare yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer Me. ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the foundations of the earth? Tell *Me*, if you have understanding. ⁵ Who determined its measurements? Surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? ⁶ To what were its foundations fastened? Or who laid its cornerstone, ⁷ When the morning stars sang together, And all the sons of God shouted for joy? ⁸ "Or *who* shut in the sea with doors, When it burst forth *and* issued from the womb; ⁹ When I made the clouds its garment, And thick darkness its swaddling band; ¹⁰ When I fixed My limit for it, And set bars and doors; ¹¹ When I said, 'This far you may come, but no farther, And here your proud waves must stop!'

2 Corinthians 6:1-13 We then, *as* workers together *with Him* also plead with *you* not to receive the grace of God in vain. ² For He says: "In an acceptable time I have heard you, And in the day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now *is* the accepted time; behold, now *is* the day of salvation. ³ We give no offense in anything, that our ministry may not be blamed. ⁴ But in all *things* we commend ourselves as ministers of God: in much patience, in tribulations, in needs, in distresses, ⁵ in stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in fastings; ⁶ by purity, by knowledge, by longsuffering, by kindness, by the Holy Spirit, by sincere love, ⁷ by the word of truth, by the power of God, by the armor of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, ⁸ by honor and dishonor, by evil report and good report; as deceivers, and *yet* true; ⁹ as unknown, and *yet* well known; as dying, and behold we live; as chastened, and *yet* not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and *yet* possessing all things. ¹¹ O Corinthians! We have spoken openly to you, our heart is wide open. ¹² You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted by your *own* affections. ¹³ Now in return for the same (I speak as to children), you also be open.

p Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it!



ATHANASIAN CREED - PART THREE

Note: In this context the word catholic means universal. Thus when we talk about the catholic faith we mean the one and only true faith which God has given to us in His word.

- p But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- c Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.
- p He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:
- c perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;
- p equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.
- c Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:
- p one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity

into flesh but by the assumption of the humanity into God;

- c one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.
- p For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,
- c who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again from the dead, ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- p At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.
- c And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.
- All This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved. Amen

5 All power is here and round me now; Faithful I stand in rule and vow, While 'tis not I, but ever Thou: Thy will be done.


SERMON

Mark 4:35-41 ³⁵ On the same day, when evening had come, He said to them, "Let us cross over to the other side." ³⁶ Now when they had left the multitude, they took Him along in the boat as He was. And other little boats were also with Him. ³⁷ And a great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that it was already filling. ³⁸ But He was in the stern, asleep on a pillow. And they awoke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?" ³⁹ Then He arose and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace, be still!" And the wind ceased and there was a great calm. ⁴⁰ But He said to them, "Why are you so fearful? How *is it* that you have no faith?" ⁴⁴ And they feared exceedingly, and said to one another, "Who can this be, that even the wind and the sea obey Him!"

He is currently receiving oxygen and injections to prevent blood clots. With all of this and more, the CLC Board of Missions and the KIN-SHIP Committee have decided to provide financial help to assist with humanitarian efforts and medical bills. Offerings to the KINSHIP General Fund will help with this effort to help those who are suffering in Asia at this time. Please remember our brethren in your prayers!
