
CONFESSION OF SINS



THE WORD

Ecclesiastes 5:10-20 ¹⁰ He who loves silver will not be satisfied with silver; Nor he who loves abundance, with increase. This also *is* vanity. ¹¹ When goods increase, They increase who eat them; So what profit have the owners Except to see *them* with their eyes? ¹² The sleep of a laboring man *is* sweet, Whether he eats little or much; But the abundance of the rich will not permit him to sleep. ¹³ There is a severe evil *which* I have seen under the sun:


Riches kept for their owner to his hurt. 14 But those riches perish through misfortune; When he begets a son, there is nothing in his hand. 15 As he came from his mother's womb, naked shall he return, To go as he came; And he shall take nothing from his labor Which he may carry away in his hand. 16 And this also is a severe evil-- Just exactly as he came, so shall he go. And what profit has he who has labored for the wind? ¹⁷ All his days he also eats in darkness. And he has much sorrow and sickness and anger. 18 Here is what I have seen: It is good and fitting for one to eat and drink, and to enjoy the good of all his labor in which he toils under the sun all the days of his life which God gives him; for it is his heritage. 19 As for every man to whom God has given riches and wealth, and given him power to eat of it, to receive his heritage and rejoice in his labor-- this is the gift of God. 20 For he will not dwell unduly on the days of his life, because God keeps him busy with the joy of his heart.

Hebrews 4:1-13 Therefore, since a promise remains of entering His rest, let us fear lest any of you seem to have come short of it. ² For indeed the gospel was preached to

us as well as to them; but the word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in those who heard it. ³ For we who have believed do enter that rest, as He has said: "So I swore in My wrath, 'They shall not enter My rest," although the works were finished from the foundation of the world. ⁴ For He has spoken in a certain place of the seventh day in this way: "And God rested on the seventh day from all His works"; 5 and again in this place: "They shall not enter My rest." 6 Since therefore it remains that some *must* enter it, and those to whom it was first preached did not enter because of disobedience, ⁷ again He designates a certain day, saying in David, "Today," after such a long time, as it has been said: "Today, if you will hear His voice, Do not harden your hearts." ⁸ For if Joshua had given them rest, then He would not afterward have spoken of another day. ⁹ There remains therefore a rest for the people of God. 10 For he who has entered His rest has himself also ceased from his works as God did from His. ¹¹ Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience. 12 For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and

marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. ¹³ And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things *are* naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we *must give* account.

p Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it!

3 Through many dangers, toils, and snares I have already come; 'Tis grace has brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home.



No one *is* good but One, *that is*, God. ¹⁹ "You know the commandments: Do not commit adultery,"Do not murder,"Do not steal,"Do not bear false witness,"Do not defraud,"Honor your father and your mother." ²⁰ And he answered and said to Him, "Teacher, all these things I have kept from my youth." ²¹ Then Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, take up the cross, and follow Me." ²² But he was sad at this word, and went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.

School Board Notes

School pictures were taken on Sept 30.

The dates for VBS next year were set July 11-15 2022

We are organizing a youth camping outing for next summer along with some of the other churches in the area. Children in 5th grade and up will be invited. We would value input from those who are interested. We are considering the week following VBS. We are wondering if it would work better to schedule it during the week or the weekend?

Ann's name was added to the concession account.

We are planning monthly basketball practices on Saturdays for the kids in the congregation. The first basketball practice is scheduled for October 30 from 9am to 10:30am. All children 3rd grade through 8th grade are welcome to join.

Faith paid \$492 in equalization for the teachers' conference.

The teachers will be gone this week from October 20 through the 22 for teachers' conference in Milwaukee.

The council discussed a list of some delinquent members. This list will be discussed at the voters' meeting this coming Thursday.

It was reported that the windows in the classrooms need to be fixed. This was added to the list of maintenance items.

A new board was made for the organ and an attempt was made to install it. There was a problem getting the new board to work with the organ. Another piece needs to be repaired. This slightly increase the estimated cost of fixing the organ. Currently the pipes on the organ are working but nothing else.

The council discussed what to do with the stain glass windows in the church. The council is recommending to the voters that we look into removing the stain glass and putting in regular clear glass. We can add new stain glass to the windows as the money becomes available.

The council is recommending ending Monday night services at the end of October. Part of the reason for this is because daylight savings begins on November 7th. This will be brought to the voters' meeting on Thursday.
