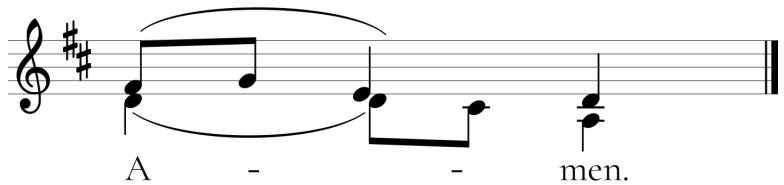




CONFESSION OF SINS

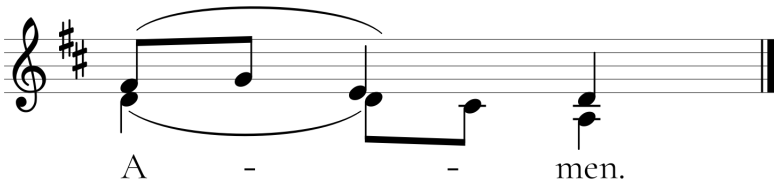

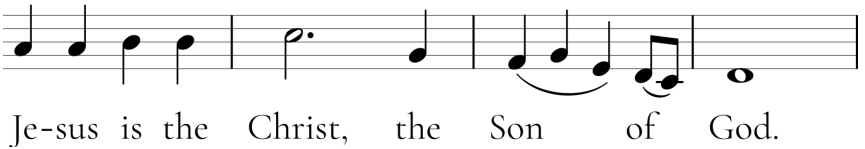
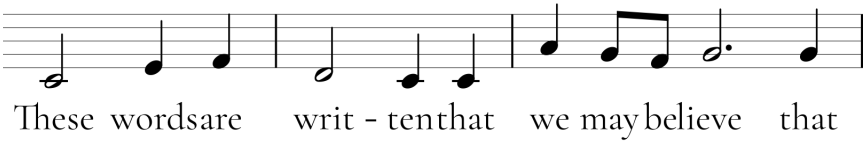
THE WORD

Jeremiah 17:5-8 ⁵ Thus says the LORD, "Cursed is the man who trusts in mankind And makes flesh his strength, And whose heart turns away from the LORD. ⁶ "For he will be like a bush in the desert And will not see when prosperity comes, But will live in stony wastes in the wilderness, A land of salt without inhabitant. ⁷ "Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD And whose trust is the LORD. ⁸ "For he will be like a tree planted by the water,

That extends its roots by a stream And will not fear when
the heat comes; But its leaves will be green, And it will
not be anxious in a year of drought Nor cease to yield
fruit.

1 Corinthians 15:12-20 ¹² Now if Christ is preached, that
He has been raised from the dead, how do some among
you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ But if
there is no resurrection of the dead, not even Christ has
been raised; ¹⁴ and if Christ has not been raised, then our
preaching is vain, your faith also is vain. ¹⁵ Moreover we
are even found *to be* false witnesses of God, because we
witnessed against God that He raised Christ, whom He
did not raise, if in fact the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the
dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised; ¹⁷
and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless;
you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have fall-
en asleep in Christ have perished. ¹⁹ If we have hoped in
Christ in this life only, we are of all men most to be pitied.
²⁰ But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first
fruits of those who are asleep.

SERMON

Luke 6:17-26 ¹⁷ And He descended with them, and stood on a level place; and *there was* a great multitude of His disciples, and a great throng of people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon, ¹⁸ who had come to hear Him, and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were being cured. ¹⁹ And all the multitude were trying to touch Him, for power was coming from Him and healing *them* all. ²⁰ And turning His gaze on His disciples, He *began* to say, "Blessed *are* you *who are* poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. ²¹ "Blessed *are* you who hunger now, for you shall be satisfied. Blessed *are* you who weep now, for you shall laugh. ²² "Blessed are you when men hate you, and ostracize you, and cast insults at you, and spurn your name as evil, for the sake of the Son of Man. ²³ "Be glad in that day, and leap *for joy*, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for in the same way their fathers used to treat the prophets. ²⁴ "But woe to you who are rich, for you are receiving your comfort in full. ²⁵ "Woe to you who are well-fed now, for you shall be hungry. Woe *to you* who laugh now, for

you shall mourn and weep. ²⁶ "Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for in the same way their fathers used to treat the false prophets.
